Art This term we are exploring portraits. Use a mirror to look at your face and then make a self-portrait. Look carefully at the colour of your eyes and hair. Use pencils, crayons or paint (whichever you have available). Make a portrait for everyone that lives in your home. Make sure you take time to look carefully at their features before you start. You could make frames for your faces. Explore some famous portraits - either online or at a museum (for example, The Ashmolean). Choose one that you particularly like. What do you like about it?	Maths We are exploring 3D shapes. Can you find a cone, sphere, cube, cuboid, pyramid and cylinder in or around your home? Make a tally chart for each room and compare your results. Make a junk model with a range of boxes and containers. Which 3D shapes make the best models? Explore what 3D shapes look like when they are flattened out (net). You can do this by very carefully cutting along their edges. You could draw around their nets and compare.	R.E. We are exploring the Christian Nativity Story Make a set of charcaters to retell this special story. You could make paper finger puppets or lolly stick puppets. Perform the story to someone at home. Make a map to show the journeys from the Christmas story. Key characters are Mary, Joseph, Angel Gabriel, Shepherds and the kings. They all make journeys and should be included in your map. Write an account as if you were one of the characters from the Nativity story. What did you see and what did you do?
What do you like about it? Can you guess what this person was like?
