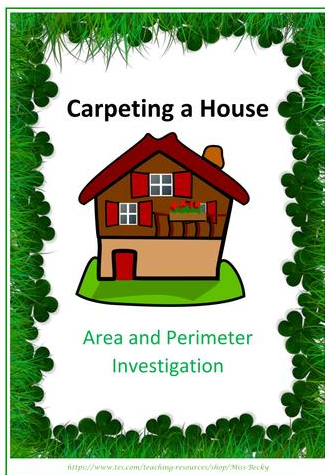
Maths

To firm things up - along with this homework sheet - is a problem solving challenge!



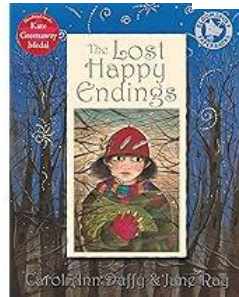
Imagine that you have just bought a house opposite school - you will need to buy carpets for all the rooms and so you have to find the perimeter and area for each room!

Think about what happens to the Happy Endings after they have been shaken out of Jub's bag.

Now, think of a short piece of writing that could be described as a 'happy ending', and imagine where it ends up. Picture the scene in your mind's eye of where it lands and what is happening when it does. Who is there to receive it? Are they alone or are they with someone else? Where are they? What time of day is it? What are they wearing? What are they doing? How do they feel when the happy ending arrives?

When you have a clear image in your mind, take a pencil and a piece of paper and start to draw the image you thought about. How will you incorporate the words of the happy ending into the image? If you have coloured pencils, felt tips or crayons, you could use these to add to the atmosphere of the scene. How will you show the time of day, for example? Enjoy!
