Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the new school year. It is great to see the Year 2 children coming in with so much confidence and eagerness to support our new members of the class. A very warm welcome to the new Year One children, who have made an equally impressive start to the term, and their families. The new class is already working together with enthusiasm and cooperation. I am sure that we are going to have a fantastic and productive year together!

We are starting with a popular cross curricular theme of '**Fire, Fire!**' which is based on The Great Fire of London. We will lead gently into this theme, after starting with our whole school theme based on the book 'Five Bears' by C. Rayner which is all about friendship.

The science theme will be '**Everyday Materials and their uses**'. This topic helps the children to identify not only different materials but also focuses on their suitability for particular uses. In Key Stage 1 we also study the changing seasons throughout the year.

Home Learning tasks will commence for Year 2 on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> September, more details will follow. Year 1 tasks will commence in January. Please continue to share books with your child and use the Reading Record to add any comments on home reading. Please see the additional sheet on RWI home support and these sessions will commence on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September. Your child will bring home a set of words to practise spelling through the week and we have a Spelling Check on a Friday.
