

Home Learning Activities November 2022

We are continuing our '**London's Burning**' topic this term, as well as learning lines and songs for our Christmas performance. Below are ideas for Home Learning Activities based on some of the learning that we will be doing in class over the next few weeks, these include some Christmas activities. Please select which activity or activities you would like to work on. You can choose one task or more and we would like to share one of your pieces of work in the week beginning: Monday 5th December.

Activities:

Science - Materials:

1. Go on a material hunt around your home. Can you identify the following materials? (wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard) What are they being used for? Find a way of recording what you have found out.
2. Create a poster about materials and their different uses.

Christmas:

1. Find out about Christmas in a different country. How is it different to your Christmas? You may like to create a power point or poster to tell us what you have found out.
2. Create a Christmas tree out of something different. Lego, plasticine, the choice is yours.
3. Write your own Christmas story, song or poem.

Computing:

This term we are going to be thinking about using digital technology to create a painting.

1. Use the online programme 'paintz app' to explore all the different tools we have been using in class. Create a Christmas or The Great Fire of London themed picture. Don't forget to include a title for your creation and add your name. Also, don't forget to try and use a selection of different tools.
2. Have a go at re-creating a piece of artwork that you may have seen at home or in a museum. You may like to draw it first. Use paintz app or another painting programme to re-create it. You may like to use a specific style of art, for example, Pointillism (using dots to create a picture) or an abstract painting.
