Day to Day Basics

PE continues to be on 2 days - on a **Wednesday** and **Friday**. Please come dressed in your PE kit on these days. You will not need your uniform.

You will need a **water bottle (with water not squash)** and your **outdoor shoes** in school every day.



We have clear expectations in our classroom of how to show respect, resilience and relationships. We have also talked about what it means to "live life in all its fullness" John 10:10 and know in school we are safe, welcome, loved and challenged to learn and be at our best.

Our Topic and Learning

Our class topic is called **Magnificent Monarchs**. This project includes learning about the history of rulers in Britain, looking at the Tudors and the Elizabethans in more detail.

We are starting our literacy learning with a 3 week focus on the book '**The Barnabus Project**' by **Terry Fan**



This will be followed by '**The Thames and Tide Club**' by **Katya Balen** after the half term break.

In **Maths** we will be focusing on **mass, capacity and measurement** followed by quick hits on **money, time, shape and statistics** all the while applying our calculation skills from throughout the year.



In **DT** we are looking at **mechanisms** such as pulleys, levers and sliders. Science continues with our focus on **animals, humans and survival** by sorting and classifying animals based on their features.

Our **Computing** topic this term has us creating word processing documents resulting in an informative word document or powerpoint.

In **RE** we will be learning about how Hindus believe that the aspects of one God are represented by many deities.

Home Learning

In Evenlode Class we would like the children to continue to read daily, or as much as possible, any stories or texts that they are interested in! You can record any reading in your child's Reading Record book. It is very helpful to know when and what your child has been reading.
