

## Home Learning Activities 30.9.22

Please see below our new menu for Home Learning Activities for the coming weeks.

We would like Year 2 children to select which activity or activities that they would like to work on. You can choose one task or more. We would like to share at least one of your pieces of topic work so please bring into school for Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October. You are also welcome to send in photos, if easier.

Year 1 are very welcome to take part in these activities but equally there is no expectation to at this stage.

### The Great Fire of London Topic:

1. **Make a model of a home from the time of the Great Fire - 1666.**  
Think about which materials would have been used, compared to today.
2. **Make some bread.** The Great Fire we think, started in a bakery where bread was being made. How easy is it to make bread? You could investigate how bread was different in the time of the Great Fire. Don't forget to taste your bread!
3. **London today in 2022.** How has London changed? What sort of place is London? Make a picture of a London view or a collage showing different landmarks of London. You could add facts about London.
4. **Diary writing.** Samuel Pepys is famous for writing about this time in history. Can you step back in time and make some diary entries about the week of the Great Fire?
5. **Make a 'Top 10 list of facts'** on the Great Fire. What would your top three be? Remember they have to be interesting!
6. **Make a quiz** on the Great Fire. You could use the facts from above.
7. **Make a piece of art** on The Great Fire. This could be using any material of your choice such as pens, paint or collage.
