In order to support the school, we ask parents and carers to:

- Uphold all school policies
- Provide your child with the correct uniform and necessary equipment

- Ensure your child has enough sleep and a healthy diet to aid learning
- Inform the school of any concerns or issues that may affect learning or behaviour
